School Council

Children in School Council represent their school on behalf of every class from Year 1 to Year 6. Each class votes for their 2 representatives at the start of the school year through a democratic process, and the school council meets every half term.

Councillors will meet and discuss concerns raised by their peers as well as Health and Safety elements and eco-friendly issues within their school. Councillors will run Walk

to School days. At the beginning of each school year, the council will choose one element of school life that they wish to improve. They will then research their vision for this as well as how much they will need to fundraise. School Council will have the responsibility to plan, organise and promote their fundraising events and keep all stakeholders up to date with their totals.

School Councillors from each school in the federation will meet to discuss federation events and concerns and support with developing relationships with the schools in the federation.

Reading Ambassadors

Children who are Reading Ambassadors represent their school on behalf of every class from Year 1 to Year 6. Each class votes for their 2 representatives at the start of the school year through a democratic process, and the ambassadors meet every half term.

wish to improve with a key focus on how to develop a lifelong love of reading within their school. They will then research their vision for this as well as how much they will need to fundraise. Ambassadors will have the responsibility to plan, organise and promote their fundraising events and keep all stakeholders up to date with their totals.

SMSC Committee

how it can do better at supporting and developing SMSC. They will also be responsible for reflective areas around school. At the beginning of each school year, the children will choose an element of Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural

development that they wish to improve. They will then research their vision for this as well as how much they will need to fundraise. SMSC Committee members will have the responsibility to plan, organise and promote their fundraising events and keep all stakeholders up to date with their totals.

Mental Health and Wellbeing Ambassador



Children who are MHWB Ambassadors represent their school on behalf of every class from Year 1 to Year 6. Each class votes for their 2 representatives at the start of the school year through a democratic process, and the MHWB Ambassadors meet every half term.

Ambassadors will meet and discuss concerns raised by their peers as well as auditing the school to see how it can do better at supporting and developing

Wellbeing that they wish to improve using 'The Five Ways to Wellbeing' as a guide as well as gaining the Healthy Schools Award. They will then research their vision for this as well as how much they will need to fundraise.
