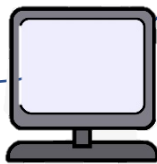


What is your favourite song? Create a dance to it.

Can you get a family member to do it with you?

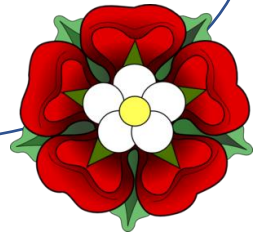
Create a poster all about your favourite Tudor Monarch.

How many questions can you get right? Don't forget to include the answers!



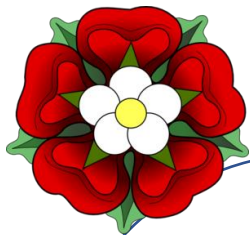

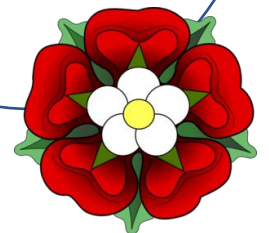
Spring Term 1

Dress up as the job you want to be when you grow up. Don't forget to upload it to Seesaw!

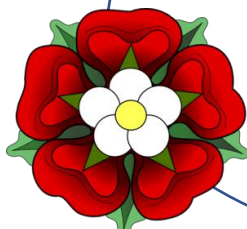


Make your own Tudor house. What would it look like? Are there any Tudor houses near where you live? What will make your Tudor house strong?



Use fruit and vegetables as ingredients and create a traditional Tudor dish.

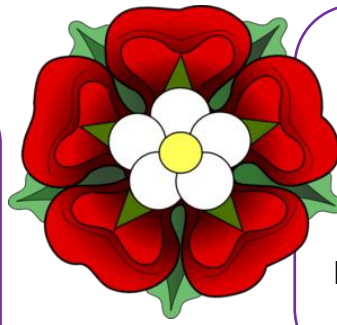
Write or record your review of the dish.



Learning this half term

Maths

We are continuing our work on multiplication and division this half term. We are really focusing on practising our timetables table and securing this knowledge.



History

We are learning about the Terrible Tudors this half term. The children will explore life as a rich and poor Tudor as well as learning about King Henry VI and the war of the roses.

Science

Habitats is our focus for science this half term. Deepening our knowledge of animals as well as their classification and adaptations for their habitat.



English

Religious Education

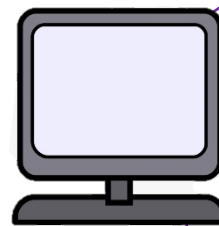
Our RE focus is Hinduism this half term. We are learning to answer the question: What does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today?

Design Technology

Our DT focus is textiles. We will be learning how to sew as well as designing and making a product. This will be linked with our History learning.

PSHE

In PSHE we will be exploring the theme of 'Dreams and Goals'. We will be looking at our own aspirations as well as how to have a positive mindset.



Computing
